

DEATH: THE WAGES OF SIN

"For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 6:23)

When man separated himself from God by his own sin, he placed himself in a condition of his own making, but not one he has the power to overcome.

There is a demand of righteousness by God for those who are in relationship with Him (Mat. 5:6,20). Righteousness is part and parcel of man's redemption from His sin (1 Cor. 1:30). And it took the love of God to mercifully extend His grace (Jesus Christ) in order to overcome our own sin and be restored to righteousness. "But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved)," (Ephesians 2:4–5). "He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." (2 Corinthians 5:21)

We must then accept our need for redemption. There can be no negotiation about either the demand for redemption or the process through which it is obtained. Simply stated we face eternal death and punishment without it (Mat. 25:46).

The biblical examples we see of this shows the honest heart to respond with the general inquiry as to what needs to be done to be saved from this horrible plight (See Acts 2:37; 16:30). It is interesting to note that in both situations the need was to acknowledge their belief in the Christ Who died for them and to obey His commands to be made righteous. Further, this is the case of every conversion recorded in the Book of Acts. Nothing said to them about being saved by "faith only" or offering something called a "sinners prayer". Simply instruction to believe, repent and be baptized.

As we observe man's responses today, far too often we see him inventing ways to please God rather than inquiring of God's word how it should be done.

If we are to be saved from perdition, it will be due to a knowledge and obedience to the gospel of Jesus Christ, which Paul says is the power of God unto salvation to everyone who believes.....(Romans 1:16). He makes this even clearer speaking to the Thessalonians about the wrath of God, "For after all it is only just for God to repay with affliction those who afflict you, and to give relief to you who are afflicted and to us as well when the Lord Jesus will be revealed from heaven with His mighty angels in flaming fire, dealing out retribution to those who do not know God and to those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus." (2 Thessalonians 1:6–8)

As we consider our future life beyond physical death, we must choose between life in heaven with the Lord and eternal death and punishment in hell with Satan. Jesus is the One Who has the authority to save us from this eternal punishment and all He asks is our obedience to His commands (Hebrews 5:8,9).

Simple enough. Just use common sense, a rare commodity in matters religious.

HE MADE HIMSELF NOTHING

"Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross-

Philippians 2:5-8 (NIV)

This passage is so rich. But we shall examine only one jewel here. It's the phrase, He "made himself nothing" (v.7a). Notice, Jesus "made Himself." He didn't get a memo. He wasn't pushed out of heaven. He was fully engaged in God's whole plan!

The phrase, "made himself nothing," as the NIV translates it, is the basis for a lot of false teaching. Some translations rightly put it, "He emptied Himself." The question that has been debated for centuries is: emptied Himself of what? Some say Jesus emptied Himself of Deity and He became merely a first-century Jewish man; no God, just Jesus, the man. But the Bible teaches the Incarnation of Jesus, 100 percent God; 100 percent man, undiminished Deity dwelling in humanity. This makes Him not "a 200 percent something," as one man scoffed, but a 100 percent Redeemer, Savior and Mediator.

You may ask: "Well, what did He empty Himself of then?" Answer, at least five things:

He emptied Himself of glory. In **John 17:5**, Jesus prayed, "Glorify me...with the glory that I had with you before the world existed." He gave up the adoration of departed saints and angels when He came into this world.

He emptied Himself of independent authority. In **John 5:30**, Jesus said, "I can do nothing on My own." He brought Himself into a different relationship with the Father where ALL of His activities and actions were uniquely submissive to Him.

He released the voluntary exercise of His divine attributes. There is evidence that Jesus was sometimes omniscient and sometimes not (compare John 1:43–51 with Matthew 24:36.)

He gave up His riches. **2 Corinthians 8:9** says, "...though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich."

He gave up His intimate relationship with the Father. Who can describe the fellowship that exists between the first and second Person of the Trinity? And to hear Jesus on the cross in **Matthew 27:46** shouting, "My God, why have You forsaken Me?"

He made Himself nothing—for you and me.

Does God require obedience? Must I keep the commandments?

Is it necessary to obey God to maintain a relationship with God? Do I have to keep His commandments in

order to be saved? The Gospel of John is often called the gospel of belief because of its clear emphasis on faith. Bible faith, however, does not nullify the necessity of obedience.

Consider the following statements, all made by Jesus, himself, in the Gospel of John.

- John 14:15: "If you love Me, keep My commandments.
- John 14:21: "He who has MY commandments and keeps them, it is he who loves Me. And he who loves Me will be loved by My Father."
- John 14:23: "Jesus answered and said to him,
 If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word; and
 MY Father will love him, and we will come to him
 and make Our home with him."
- John 14:24: "He who does not love Me does not keep My words..."
- John 15:10: "If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love."
- John 15:14: "You are my friends if you do whatever I command you."

Don't let anyone convince you that you don't have to *do* what God says.

In seeking to make our calling and election sure it is essential that we give the Lord our best love (Mark:12:29-30), the best of our gifts which starts with ourselves (2 Cor. 8:1-5; Rom. 12:1) and the best of our labors (Luke 10:7; Matthew 5:16; 1 Cor. 15:58). How does our life stack up against Matthew 6:33—...seek first the kingdom of God... or Matthew 6:19-21 — ...lay up for yourself treasures in heaven... or Colossians 3:1-2—...seek things above, set your mind on things above... or 2 Timothy 2:15—...study to show yourself approved... or Matthew 5:16-- ...letting your light shine.. or 1 John 2:15-17 — ...love not the world... or 2 Peter 2:2-11 — ... add to your faith... and how about James 2:18-20? How does our life measure up to the standard of Christian conduct revealed in 1 Thessalonians **5:12-21** and **Ephesians 4:25-32**?

Do you want to be saved is a great question to give answer to but it has a companion question that must also be answered, namely, are we willing to do what must be done in order make our calling and election sure? To God be the glory forever and ever!
