## The Gospel of Jesus is Better News By Jay Dixon

The Good news about Jesus is timeless; although old, it's new, fresh and generates excitement when coming to the ears of one for the 1st time. It should likewise continue to stimulate us throughout our lives.

Why?

The Good News about Jesus has eternal repercussions. The greatest news story ever told in our country, whether it be in regards to a particular war that was fought and won that resulted in freedom, some medical discovery that saved millions or something else while I don't discredit that news for

a moment, and have no problem with remembering and honoring those days, that news, while good, provided humanity with temporal benefits and pales in comparison to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The Gospel of Jesus provides us with eternal benefits. That simple yet profound fact distinguishes the Good about Jesus from all other news deemed good that one may receive. (1st Peter 1:18-23)

What then should be our response to sharing this news?

On October 21st 1805 in the Battle of Trafalgar the British fleet led by Horatio Nelson defeated the combined forces of Spain and France. Had the British fleet been defeated it would have cleared the way at this time for a Napoleon led British invasion, making this a very significant victory. A young naval lieutenant was chosen to be the dispatch rider to deliver this good news. He considered it a great honor to have been chosen and with great diligence raced to his audience delivering this news with great fervor. While this was good news the young dispatch rider was also forced to deliver the sad news that admiral Horatio Nelson (who many referred to as Lord Nelson) died in the battle that brought victory. This being true, even though it was good news that victory had been attained, there was a sense of sadness because their Lord had died in battle. Our Lord likewise died in battle in order to provide us with victory however unlike Horatio Nelson our LORD did not stay in the grave but rather was risen again the 3rd day for our justification, thus providing us with an eternal victory. That's Good News!!! In Matthew 28:5-6 the angel of LORD said to the women who came to the tomb of Jesus, "Fear not ye: for I know that ye seek Jesus, which was crucified. He is not here: for He is risen, as He said. Come: see the

place where the Lord lay." That's Good News!!!

The young naval lieutenant chosen to deliver the news of victory in the fall of 1805, with honor, rode with great fervor to deliver a message that revealed temporal victory. We should consider it an even greater honor to deliver the Good News about Jesus and with great resolve race to our audience to impart the Gospel of Christ. The message we have reveals eternal victory and there is no element of sadness because our Lord lives. (1st Corinthians 15:55-58)

# "In None Other Is There Salvation" Dan Richardson

"And in none other is there salvation; for neither is there any other name under heaven, that is given among men, wherein we must be saved "(Acts 4:12). This story begins in Acts 3:1, when Peter and John heal a lame man "in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth" (3:5) at the door of the temple. Attracting a multitude, Peter had opportunity to preach Jesus (3:11-26). They were seized and brought before the high court of the Jews for interrogation (4:1-7).

Peter's defense before the tribunal was to proclaim the power in Jesus' name, by which this lame man was healed, but more importantly, by which all are saved from sin (4:8-12). From Peter's sermon (3:11-26), we note these facts pertaining to Jesus.

He Is The Glorified Servant (Acts 3:13-18). The Jews crucified Jesus, but the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob – their God – glorified His Servant by raising Him from the dead. He was despised and rejected, bearing our griefs and afflictions which only we deserved because of our sin (Isaiah 53:3-9). His sacrifice was no accident, nor the result of man thwarting heaven's will, but it was accomplishing God's eternal purpose to redeem sinful man in His Son: "Yet it pleased Jehovah to bruise him; he hath put him to grief; when thou shalt make his soul an offering for sin, he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the pleasure of Jehovah shall prosper in his hand" (Isaiah 53:10). Jesus was glorified because He accomplished what the Father sent Him to do - be a sacrifice for sin ( John 17:4-5).

He Is The Prophet Like Moses (Acts 3:22- 24). Through Jesus, God speaks to us today (Hebrews 1:2). His message can be known ( John 8:32); Peter said, "to Him shall ye hearken" (Acts 3:22a). His word

is complete, all sufficient to accomplish its divine purpose; man must obey "in all things whatsoever he shall speak unto you" (Acts 3:22b; Isaiah 55:10-11; 2 Timothy 3:16-17). And, His gospel is authoritative – those who don't "hearken" will be destroyed (3:23). It is God's power to save the sinner (Romans 1:16; James. 1:21; 1 Peter 1:22- 23).

He Is The Seed Of Abraham (Acts 3:25-26). God promised Abraham He would bless all nations in his "seed" (Genesis 22:18). The inspired apostle Paul would later explain this as having reference to the blessings for mankind in Christ Jesus (Galatians 3:16) - blessings which are a) universal - for "all the families of the earth" (Acts 3:25a; Galatians 3:28); b) spiritual "in turning away every one of you from your iniquities" (Acts 3:26); and c) conditional - because they were commanded to "repent...and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out" (Acts 3:19; cf. Acts 2:38).

God's assurance to us of our salvation in Christ is founded in the truth of His resurrection from the dead (26). This fact is substantiated by 1) The miracle worked on the lame man, confirming the truthfulness of the sermon preached (cf. Mark 16:18, 20). 2) Eyewitness testimony (15). The apostles had seen the risen Savior (Acts 1:21-22). 3) The testimony of Old Testament scripture (Acts 3;24-25; cf. John 5:39). Truly, in none other is there salvation. Have you obeyed Him?

### The Message Of Obedience

For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds; casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ (2 Corinthians 10:4-5).

All over the land, there are buildings with signs out front identifying them as being a church building. Understand something here, you can have all the signs you want, you can have really big, big signs that can be seen from far away but until you love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind and might (Mk. 12:30), until you obey Him in all things (John 14:15; Matt. 7:21-23; Luke 6:46-49), that sign means nothing. If the people inside the building are not serving God with an exacting obedience, doing what He says, how He says and when He says, they need to hear and heed the words of 2 John 9, "Anyone who goes too far and does not abide in the teachings of Christ, does not have God; the one who abides in the teaching, he has both the Father and the Son."

The message of obedience tells us we must willingly and joyfully submit ourselves to the will of our Lord and Saviour (James 1:21; James 4:7-10; John 6:68). He is the source of eternal salvation (Heb. 5:9; Heb. 12:1-3; Col. 1:12-14) and anyone who wants to be saved eternally must unwaveringly submit themselves to Him (Acts 4:12). God has given us a pattern to follow in seeking eternal salvation (2 Tim. 3:16-17. 2 Pet. 1:3). That pattern must be followed, no short cuts, no bargain basement, no sale days (Matt. 15:9; Gal. 1:6-9; James 2:10-11). Anyone who wants to be saved eternally must follow exactly what God commands (Deut. 5:32-33; Deut. 11:26-28; 2 John 6-11).

Friends, there is no margin to play on--it is His way or else. You cannot follow the doctrines of men and be saved (Matt. 15:7-9; John 6:68; Heb. 5:8-9) Do you believe this? I surely pray you do because your soul is at stake.

Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were making an appeal through us; we beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."

(2 Corinthians 5:17–21)
