I WANT TO FOLLOW JESUS, BUT...

Jesus said, ""Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. "But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal; for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:19-21) He also said, ""But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." (Matthew 6:33)

The greatest threat to the church in America today is the material success of its members. There is nothing wrong with being wealthy as we will show later, but there is the desire of the flesh that can become enraged with wanting more once we have experienced some levels of wealth.

How wealthy are we and how did it come about? Wealth is a comparative thing as we measure it. When we compare ourselves to others in different circumstances we can see even those with modest assets are wealthy by comparison. Of course when we are compared to others who have had greater success, we do not appear to be wealthy at all. Most of us in this nation fall into this category. We are not among the most wealthy with maybe a few exceptions.

There are two overriding principles concerning material success that Paul speaks to Timothy about as he leaves him in Ephesus to,instruct certain men not to teach strange doctrines.....(1 Tim. 1:3).

Switching our attention to **Chapter 6**, we see at least one of those strange doctrines was that godliness would bring gain. Specifically Paul teaches that when a slave who is a Christian finds himself under a master who is a brother in Christ, he is not to attempt to use that relationship to enhance himself in some material way (see verses 1,2) The instruction in **verses 3-5** is that all such teaching is done by those who are so filled with pride they are ignorant of

sound teaching. This subject is also covered in **Ephesians 6:5-9** where he advises both slave and master to conduct themselves toward one another understanding they serve a greater Master who is in heaven.

Chapter 6 then proceeds to teach us the principle that the love of money is the root of all evil. We can see that in the teaching of those in verses 3-5 who would try to use godliness as a means of material gain.

At the end of the chapter he gives instruction to those who are rich, teaching them to be rich in good works by sharing their wealth generously to attain for themselves the real treasure, eternal life. This is the explanation of the earlier phrase thatgodliness is a means of great gain when accompanied by contentment. (Verse 6)

Now, let us make application of these principles. Godliness is not intended to bring material gain. We are not supposed to be concerned primarily with material gain. We are to be content with our daily needs. Remember verse 8, "If we have food and covering, with these we shall be content." Now. compare this with Jesus' instruction when He taught His disciples to pray, Give us this day our daily bread. (Mat. 6:11) After all, the failure of the rich young ruler was not having wealth, but that it was more important than following the Lord.

Will you follow Jesus?

TWO MEN 'KNOW' THEY ARE SAVED

The first man bases his assurance of salvation on his experience. He has been assured that when he completely turned his life over to Jesus Christ, accepted Him as his personal Savior, and received Him into his heart, that an inner peace and feeling of well-being would sweep his soul; that he would be able to recognize that feeling when it came; and that his peace and feeling of well-being would be unmistakable evidence of his salvation. In keeping with that teaching he did "receive Jesus into his heart." He did feel this wonderful peace sweep his soul. And he "knows" that he is saved.

The second man's assurance is based on the promise of God. He had read in God's word, "He who believes and is baptized will be saved" (Mark 16:16). From other passages he had learned the necessity of repentance and confession of faith (Acts 2:38; 8:37; Romans 10:10). Trusting God's promise of salvation, he obeyed from the heart those commands (Romans 6:17), and has never doubted since that God forgave him of all his past sins, according to His promise.

The first man's assurance of salvation is based upon an unsure foundation. The Bible teaches neither the action he has taken nor the criterion he has accepted. We do not question his feelings; but we do question that such feelings are proof of salvation, for they are the product of his teaching. The cultist who has been taught certain gross practices in religion and has become the victim of his perverted leader will experience similar feelings. If the feelings of the latter are not sufficient proof of salvation, neither are the feelings of the former.

"But an angel appeared and spoke to me," someone may be thinking; or, "I spoke in tongues." The Bible teaches, however, that even unusual, inexplicable occurrences in one's life cannot set aside the teaching of God's revealed word. Many who will be in Hell will have said, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name? (Matthew 7:22). But all their experiences, even "miracles", will not substitute for their doing the Father's will as it is recorded in the scriptures (Matthew 7:21; see Galatians 1:8; 2 Thessalonians 2:9-12; Deuteronomy 13:1-5; Colossians 2:18,19).

The second man has based his assurance on a solid foundation. God's promises are sure. He cannot lie (Hebrews 6:18). What He has promised He is able to perform (Romans 4:21). The person who obeys His commandments through trust in His promises can know, because God is faithful. "Now by this we know that we know Him, if we keep His commandments" (1 John 2:3).

We ask our readers, "Who really demonstrates strong faith in God: the one who simply trusts God's promises and finds assurance in His word or the one who must experience some overwhelming feeling that

sweeps his soul?" God's judgment will be based, not on what we "know" but on His word. Be not deceived.

This was posted by Ben Carson a couple years ago. Think about it.

A preacher was driving home one night with his wife and two daughters in the car.

It was raining and dark, and because of the intensity of the rain, he could hardly see past his headlights.

On the way, he had to drive over a huge bridge. There were signs posted all along the bridge that said "DO NOT PICK UP HITCH-HIKERS."

There was an institute for the criminally insane near the base of the bridge and sometimes people would escape from it and try to hitch a ride.

On this particular night, as he turned his car on to the bridge, he had to drive exceptionally slow because he could hardly see the road.

Somewhere near the top of the bridge, a man suddenly appeared in the headlights. He was soaked, standing in the middle of the road with his shirt off, frantically waving it over his head and screaming.

This preacher's wife said, "Oh please don't stop!
