WHAT MEN LOVE, GOD HATES

Malachi 2:16 For I hate putting away, saith Jehovah, the God of Israel, and him that covereth his garment with violence, saith Jehovah of hosts: therefore take heed to your spirit, that ye deal not treacherously.

There are an equal set of statistics on marriage and divorce in the U.S. to the number of groups maintaining those statistics. The general consensus is that the divorce rate peaked in the 70's and 80's and has trended downward since. These statistics attempt to defuse the argument that many Americans disrespect the institution of marriage, but do not take into consideration those people who simply co-habit and reject marriage altogether. The N.Y. Times Survey shows marriages in the 70's and 80's ended in divorce 45+% of the time. In the 90's it is nearly 35% and in the 2000's it is approximately 15%. While this does show a decline, the later marriages will undoubtedly increase somewhat with more time.

The question is, "What causes a marriage to end in divorce?" The first and foremost problem is the lack of respect for what marriage represents. It is a union, blessed by God, to enable two people to assist each other in lives devoted to God, the Creator. God designed and instituted marriage (Gen. 2:23,24). It was planned to last "until death do us part" (Rom. 7:2,3). Man has long since decided it is for pleasure, convenience and any number of purposes that once ended, entitle each of the partners to end the marriage.

There are certainly demands on each party and sacrifices both must make for a marriage to endure the test of time. The attitude of the husband to his wife according to scripture will cause him to make a serious commitment beyond infatuation and the sex appeal of his wife. Paul said, **Eph. 5:25** Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself up for it; We do wonder if husbands are as committed to their wives as Christ is to the church. In turn he addressed the attitude of the wife as well. **Eph. 5:22**, Wives, be in subjection unto your own husbands, as unto the Lord.

I overheard a discussion on the subject once where

one person thought he was taking a strong stance on marriage by saying it should be a 50-50 relationship. He was corrected by a gospel preacher who told him it had to be a 100-100 relationship to succeed. Each person has to be fully committed to the success of the marriage. This will lead them to give full consideration to their spouse and sacrifice if needed to sustain the marriage.

Many people in the world completely dismiss the teaching of Christ on marriage and worry little about the effect on the eternal destination of their souls. Jesus taught there was only one reason acceptable for a person to divorce and remarry without sin. Fornication on the part of their spouse. He sets forth clearly those who divorce and remarry for other reasons have become adulterers and as such will be judged in the final day (Mat. 5:32; 19:3-9; 2 Cor. 5:10). This principle is set forth by John the Baptist when he told Herod, concerning his marriage to his brother's wife, it is not lawful for thee to have her (Mat. 14:4)

But even those who do not consider the spiritual side of divorce should recognize the benefits healthy marriages have socially. Divorce simply wreaks havoc on a society. Along with marriage comes the family. It is without controversy that society is as strong as the family unit. Illegitimate births where children are not viewed with the love and respect of two parents bring much turmoil to our society. The future success of these children is diminished by the atmosphere in which they go from children to adults. They suffer a much greater chance of dropping out of school, becoming juvenile delinquents and then struggling to gain employment and contribute to the world around them.

It is not long after this happens to our culture that we, supposedly a "Christian Nation", abdicate scripture even further in an effort to compensate for previous poor decisions. We endorse abortion of unwanted pregnancies, accept homosexual "parents" to rear children in a way God never intended.

And it all started when we chose to view marriage from our selfish viewpoint rather than accept God's.

Foolish Disregard

To dismiss God from our decisions is a most foolish thing to do. The reality of God is the most massive truth we'll ever encounter, and the most consequential. It is folly to omit this truth from our thinking, as if we expected it to move out of our way.

Some individuals disregard God by adopting the intellectual position that He does not exist. These have thought the matter through and come to the conclusion that there is no God. In their conduct, they may live as if there were a God and may even adhere to a certain spirituality, but their position, at least philosophically, is that a personal God does not exist.

If God does exist, such a denial is obviously unwise. But many of us disregard Him in a way that is no less foolish. We do this when we simply conduct our lives without taking God into serious account. This is a more practical kind of atheism. We pay lip service to a God who "perhaps" exists, but we believe that this God can be safely set aside in the actual conduct of our day-to-day affairs. He has no real impact on our lives. In **Psalm 14:1**, it is this kind of "fool" who is described. He says "There is no God" not so much by his dubious philosophy, as by his disobedient lifestyle.

There is a sense in which this kind of atheism is more arrogant than any other. In **Psalm 10**, for example, we are shown how PRESUMPTUOUS it is to disregard God: "The wicked in his proud countenance does not seek God; God is in none of his thoughts" (v. 4). "He has said in his heart, 'I shall not be moved; I shall never be in adversity" (v.6). "He has said in his heart, 'God has forgotten; He hides His face; He will never see" (v.11). "He has said in his heart, 'You will not require an account" (v.13).

When we live in this manner, we trivialize God in the most blasphemous way. Unlike the atheist who believes there is no God to be dealt with, we believe that we don't really have to deal with the God who does exist. We think that, for all practical purposes, He can be ignored. But if God is our Creator, our disregard only shows us to be foolish. It does nothing to diminish Him.

She Missed One Service

Some years ago on the front page of The Tennessean was the story of Alline Nankivell (91) of east Nashville, Tennessee. It was not a story about how the elderly help the needy or of some great thing she had accomplished in advanced years. Sadly it was the

story of her murder.

How many services would you have to miss before others would come looking for you? In the paper much was written about how she trusted people. She had been robbed and beaten several times but she continued to have a basic trust in others. In a society such as we live in it is difficult to put trust in strangers, but Nankivell always tried to see the good in others. There is a basic lesson in this aspect of her life for each of us.

Another point in the article struck me with even greater force. It is found in the following paragraph of the article: "Yesterday, when she did not show up at church, neighbors found the blood-caked body of Nankivell lying face-up across the bed in the 2000 Eastland Avenue home. Police said she appeared to have been beaten to death."

Later in the article it is pointed out she was a member of the Chapel Avenue Church of Christ.

The amazing thing to me about this story is the fact her friends were caused to check on her simply because she missed one worship service. This could mean one of two things. She could have been so faithful in her attendance of the services that everyone knew something had to be wrong if she wasn't there. She may have been such a fixture and force in the congregation and its services that her absence stood out like a sore thumb. A question: What if you had been the victim of this crime? How many services would you have to miss before others would come looking for you? Are you so irregular in your attendance that others would just assume you decided to sleep in or do other things? Can you honestly classify yourself as a faithful, regular worshiper?

On the other hand we may assume the people of the congregation were so concerned for the souls of others that when anyone, regardless of how regular or irregular they were in attending the services of the church, missed a single service they would go to check on them. When some of our number are missing, do we check on them as we should? It may be a brief comment will cause them to do better in the future.

I don't know the situation in the Nankivell story, but I would like to see more men and women to be faithful, regular worshipers and brethren who are so concerned for the souls of men that they will check on everyone not present.

Brethren need to read **Hebrews 10:22-25** more often. We cannot draw near to God, hold fast the confession of our hope, or consider our brethren to provoke them unto love and good works if we forsake the assembling of the brethren together.

How regular are you in attending the services of the saints? Would you be missed if you were absent for just one service?
