The Failure of Diotrephes Jim Stauffer

3 John 9 I wrote something to the church; but Diotrephes, who loves to be first among them, does not accept what we say. 10 For this reason, if I come, I will call attention to his deeds which he does, unjustly accusing us with wicked words; and not satisfied with this, he himself does not receive the brethren, either, and he forbids those who desire to do so and puts them out of the church. 11 Beloved, do not imitate what is evil, but what is good. The one who does good is of God; the one who does evil has not seen God.

As we look at this text we will see the problems this man had in his attempt to be a leader among God's people.

Many may dismiss any sincerity on the part of Diotrephes period. He was a bad man, there is no good to be reported at all.

He certainly was harmful to the church and is called out directly for it by the apostle John. His attitude made him intolerable as would any today who had the same attitude.

The text does not indicate any doctrinal failures on his part. What it does tell us is he had such a large ego he wanted to have preeminence in the church.

It is a far different thing to desire to see the church stand by the truth and be willing to suffer persecution for taking such a stand than to desire to be recognized for taking such a stand.

The indication is he resented the leadership of the apostle and others more so than the message they carried.

This made his deeds reprehensible and called for discipline to bring his attitude in line or to have his influence removed from the congregation.

Let us understand what he was doing and see if we can see why. He accused John with wicked words. In order to augment his position of opposing John he also refused to receive, that is have spiritual fellowship with other faithful brethren who recognized the authority of the apostle.

Now, Diotrephes goes beyond disagreeing with John and others and puts them out of the church.

Now he has gone far beyond what one can tolerate as we all search for truth in our service in the kingdom. He has usurped the authority of an apostle. That is even a step beyond some men today who may disrespect the eldership of a congregation and refuse to yield to them.

Part of the reason for this epistle is John wants to encourage them as it has been reported to him they are walking in the truth. This is the goal of every child of God. Yet Diotrephes is inhibiting their walk because he wants to have preeminence. He then carries this to the point of paranoia by putting faithful brethren out of the church. This action is reserved for those who are living in sin and will not repent rather than those who appear to be a threat to one's authority (1 Cor. 5; 2 Thess. 3).

John promises to set this matter straight with him and the church when he arrives.

Diotrephes needs a spiritual mirror, the perfect law, the law of liberty (Jas. 1:22-25) in order to see himself as he really is. He would then realize He is not conducting himself as Jesus did, Phil. 2:5 Have this mind in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: 6 who, existing in the form of God, counted not the being on an equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being made in the likeness of men; 8 and being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, becoming obedient even unto death, yea, the death of the cross. He has rejected the teaching of Christ, Matt. 20:25 But Jesus called them unto him, and said, Ye know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. 26 Not so shall it be among you: but whosoever would become great among you shall be your minister;

Churches are damaged and souls are endangered when men conduct themselves this way. Leaving a congregation for reasons other than to denounce sin is often divisive on its own.

The sad part of this is too often these men are not recognized as the divisive force they have become and many well intentioned follow their lead.

"To Whom Shall We Go?" Willard M. Cox

In His teachings, Jesus had been using some words in a spiritual way about Himself (John 6:48-59). Many of His disciples said, "This is a hard saying; who can understand it?" (v.60).

Then Jesus said, "Does this offend you?" (v.61). Jesus explained, "It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing. The words that I speak of you are spirit, and they are life" (v. 63).

"From that time many of His disciples went back and walked with Him no more. Then Jesus said to the twelve, 'Do you also want to go away?' But Simon Peter answered Him, 'Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life'" (v. 66-68).

Surely it grieved Jesus when so many left Him, to never return, but also it was refreshing to Jesus to hear one of His twelve apostles show his great faith in Him.

If those disciples forsook Jesus as their example and guide, would they turn to any of the rabbis or to the scribes, to the Pharisees, or maybe to the high priest? Would any of these people be a sinless leader, as Jesus is? Could they truly say follow me and I will give you eternal life? No, they were sinners too. Jesus had

no sin (1 Peter 2:21-24). He is the only perfect example for us. Jesus died for us (1 Corinthians 15:3-4). Jesus said, "I am He who lives, and was dead, and behold, I am alive forevermore. Amen. And I have the keys of Hades and of Death" (Revelation 1:18).

"O Death, where is your sting? O Hades, where is your victory?" The sting of death is sin, and the strength of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 15:55-57).

No person – nothing in this world – can do for us today what Jesus had done. "Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends. You are my friends if you do whatever I command you" (John 15:13-14).

Jesus is the Great Physician. "Jesus answered and said to them, 'Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to repentance" (Luke 5:31-32). Jesus is the only one who can cure the sin sick soul. He can make the sinner whole. We must take His prescription to have eternal life. Please go to Him for eternal life.

Jesus is the Loving Lawyer. "My little children, these things I write to you, so that you man not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous" (1 John 2:2). Please do not be discouraged and turn from Him. Come to Jesus. Study His Word, the New Testament. Jesus is the greatest lawyer of all time!

Almost every time I share with folks the nonnecessity of miracle working today there is an immediate jump to the conclusion that I deny the power of God to do so. Nothing could be further from the truth. I agree with the old preacher Marshall Keeble who said, "I do not deny the power of God. My God could grow apples on a barbed wire fence if He wanted to." What we are denying is the WILL of God to do so in light of the express statement of Jesus that such are not necessary for saving faith, since we have the testimony of the word of God, **John 20:29.** Could God work miracles today? Absolutely! Could God grow apples on a barbed wire fence? Sure! DOES HE? No! God provided the miraculous when, in His Divine judgment, it was necessary to accomplish His ends.
