### ARE YOU RIGHTEOUS WITHIN YOURSELF?

"And He also told this parable to some people who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and viewed others with contempt:" (Luke 18:9)

Jesus exposes self righteousness with this parable. He chose to teach in parables for a reason. Jesus called on men to follow Him. ""Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest. "Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and YOU WILL FIND REST FOR YOUR SOULS. "For My yoke is easy and My burden is light."" (Matthew 11:28–30) Yet He taught in parables. Parables that often needed some explanation for His listeners to understand. For instance He explained the parable of the sower and the parable of the tares to His disciples. His closest followers even asked Him why He taught in parables. His reply, ""Therefore I speak to them in parables; because while seeing they do not see, and while hearing they do not hear, nor do they understand. "In their case the prophecy of Isaiah is being fulfilled, which says. 'YOU WILL KEEP ON HEARING, BUT WILL NOT UNDERSTAND; YOU WILL KEEP ON SEEING, **BUT WILL NOT PERCEIVE;" (Matthew 13:13–14)** 

Jesus possessed something we do not as He taught among men. He could read their hearts (Mat. 9:4). He therefore taught in parables and in other ways that made His message readily available to anyone who desired it. But notice in His invitation call, He said, *Come unto me*. He did not say I will come and take you regardless of your interest of lack thereof.

The man used as an example in this parable about the self righteous man was one of those whose ears were dull of hearing and had trouble seeing the message of the Lord. He disregarded the Lord's message about one needing to be humble enough to accept relief from the Son of God Himself. He did so

because he was content within himself that he was righteous. This man was so proud of his own righteousness he did "good" deeds to be seen of men. ""But they do all their deeds to be noticed by men; for they broaden their phylacteries and lengthen the tassels of their garments." (Matthew 23:5)

But the great failure of men such as this one Jesus tells about is they do not understand righteousness in itself and therefore judge something righteous because it pleases their eye and their idea. Righteousness is perfect justice. One person possesses that, God Almighty. Paul tells the Romans He is, just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. (Rom. 3:26) And He grants such righteousness to mankind through the sacrifice of His Son Jesus (2 Cor. 5:21). Once a person reaches the point of this self righteous man, he will become dull of hearing and blind to the truth. He ceases to listen. He guits learning. He is no longer introspective to the point of seeing his own flaws. That man is in trouble as we see with the Pharisees and Jewish leaders of Jesus' day. Men much like some men today. A kind of man we must avoid becoming.

Such men condemned Jesus for eating with publicans and sinners (Mark 2:15-17) immediately after He had healed a leper and a paralytic in their presence. You see, they had a preconceived idea of the Messiah. He should come and recognize them for their righteousness and hold them up as an example for all to see. They were unable to see the Divine Power Jesus possessed and submit to His leadership. What they did not realize was God came to earth in the person of Jesus of Nazareth to both demonstrate and dole out righteousness. He demonstrated it in His life and gave it to all who would *come unto me*, in His death.

The most dangerous thing that can happen to us is

to become righteous within ourselves. Once that happens we will cease to listen to the Lord.

How about you? What is the basis for what you believe and how you worship? Is it something you are content with because it pleases you, or is it something the Lord is happy with because it is what He authorized you to do in order to receive the righteousness of God?

# JESUS BEGINS HIS PUBLIC MINISTRY: A PROPHET WITHOUT HONOR

"And all the people in the synagogue were filled with rage as they heard these things; and they got up and drove Him out of the city, and led Him to the brow of the hill on which their city had been built, in order to throw Him down the cliff. But passing through their midst, He went His way" (Luke 4:28-30 NASV). Jesus' manner of speaking and His message attracted great interest of those gathered in the synagogue in Nazareth; all eyes were upon Him. Most knew Him to be Joseph's son; this could be incredulity; it could simply be an obvious recognition of someone they had seen growing up in the neighborhood. If they were expecting great words and deeds from this hometown boy, they would soon be disappointed; they were soon angry beyond words. What did Jesus say that so fanned their flames of rejection?

"And He said to them, "No doubt you will quote this proverb to Me, 'Physician, heal yourself! Whatever we heard was done at Capernaum, do here in your hometown as well." It seems clear that the folks at home expected great things from Him. This proverb says that if you are a doctor and you prescribe medicine for the sick, then when you get sick, you will take the same medicine. IF Jesus, as He claimed, was the Messiah, the Son of God, the Savior of Israel, then He would be expected to do great things right there, right then. His work in other places was well- known; now, the people say "Do something here." He said, "Truly I say to you, no prophet is welcome in his hometown." Jesus would be rejected by His own people; what He came to do was out of step with hometown expectations. This initial ire is repeated often in Luke's narrative; especially are the leaders of the Jews singled out for their unbelief (Luke 9:21-22; 11:2-53).

Still, the reaction of the people in Nazareth didn't mean that Jesus wasn't a prophet sent from God; in fact, He was coming to them in the same spirit and manner of two well-known OT prophets, Elijah and Elisha. Jesus was not rejecting His own people; neither were Elijah and Elisha. But God worked through these OT prophets as He helped some needy outsiders. Why would God

help a widowed woman, a non-Jew? Why would God reach out to a non-Jew who had leprosy? Jesus, Elijah, and Elisha brought good news and healing to those *dreaded others*. Yes, unclean Gentiles, those with no status in Nazareth, were objects of God's concern. Surely this would be welcome news to the folks in Nazareth. But, not so! The people were outraged. Forgetting that it was the Sabbath, a day on which work was forbidden, they sought to execute Jesus. They, as did their fathers, continued to reject the prophets.

The gospel of the kingdom, if we allow it to do so, will change the way in which we view the world. The gospel speaks to ultimate reality for this life and the one to come. Our prejudices, our pride, our attachments to the good life, our values, all of which are predicated on our perceived self- sufficiency, must give way to the call and openness of the gospel. The despised Sidonians and Syrians would accept Jesus. His hometown neighbors would not accept Him. Will you?
